All students applying to Yorkville University are required to pay their tuition deposit through the ApplyBoard payment portal. Please make your payment by clicking here.

By paying through the ApplyBoard portal you are eligible for a \$10,000 bursary which will be applied to your tuition account after your first three terms of study. Please review the following page for the sample tuition schedule for students receiving a \$10,000 bursary. Students with transfer credits will receive a prorated bursary amount distributed across their remaining courses.

Please read all terms and conditions on the ApplyBoard payment page carefully as it contains details related to service fees that impact your deposit. By paying through this portal you will be acknowledging and accepting ApplyBoard's terms and conditions. If the deposit is paid by a third party or educational agent it is important that you are aware of the details related to service fees prior to authorizing the payment. By paying this deposit, either by a third party or directly, you are acknowledging and accepting these conditions.

When you submit your tuition deposit, you will receive a receipt and official acceptance letter. These documents are required as part of your study visa application to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). Yorkville University will contact you in advance of your start date and will provide a link to your New Student Registration Form as well as your Plan of Study.

Metro Pass	\$95 - 174 CDN / month or \$2.85 - \$5.60 for a single ride (depends on zones)	If you are planning on living close to campus, a bike might be a good idea for the spring, summer, and beginning of fall.
Health Insurance - MANDATORY	\$131 -180 CDN first 3 months of private insurance + \$38 CDN /month BC health	You must have health insurance prior to starting your classes. You can purchase a plan by visiting www.inglestudents.com/yorkvilleu
