LaSalle College Vancouver is committed to supporting individuals looking to further their education at the post-secondary level.

I am pleased to inform you that you are the recipient of the Associate of Arts Bursary. You are also preapproved to receive this Bursary for consecutive terms upon meeting the conditions outlined below.

Bursary Details

You will receive a bursary of \$117 per credit for quarter 1 (one credit = \$550, with bursary one credit = \$433.33). If you are taking 12 credits each term, your tuition fee per quarter with bursary totals \$5,200 (instead of \$6,600). If you are taking 15 credits each term, your tuition fee per quarter with bursary totals \$6,500 (instead of \$8,250). This bursary is awarded to students starting the program in October 2024 and following intakes up to and including July 2025.

Conditions to Maintain Your Bursary

You will automatically receive the bursary for consecutive terms if you meet these conditions:

- You need to remain in a full course load of at least 12 credits per term*
- You need to maintain a CGPA of 2.4/4.0
- You need to maintain continuous enrollment in your program. <u>Change of program</u>, deferral or withdrawal will result in the forfeit of your bursary.
- You need to be in good financial standing meaning you have no overdue fees from previous quarters or any type of finance holds.
- Bursary recipients must abide by LaSalle College Vancouver's Student Code of Conduct. They are expected to contribute to the college community, assist prospective students and get involved with events. Students are expected to volunteer up to one hour for every \$100 awarded.

* Exceptions to the course load requirement are made if a student has a documented learning accommodation requirement and/or is in the final quarter to complete the program.

A student quarterly fee of \$215 for Domestic students and \$215 for International students applies. An insurance fee of \$195/quarter for International students applies.

The Enrollment Agreement includes tuition for one year of study. Multi-year programs require more than one Enrollment Agreement. Each Enrollment Agreement will encompass no more than 12 months of study. Students are registered in advance of each quarter of study for a full-time course load of at least 15 credits unless otherwise specified in their financial plan.

LaSalle College Vancouver programs are regularly under review as part of its continuous improvement framework. These reviews result in changes and revisions to curricula, program content and scheduling. Program changes are published in the Academic Calendar and are effective as of the publication date. If a change occurs after a student applies and before they commence studies, the student will sign a new contract that reflects the new program curricula.

PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS MAY NOT BE WAIVED BY THE STUDENT OR THE INSTITUTION

Individuals seeking admission to a full-time program are required to complete and submit the following:

1. Admission interview (in person, by phone or by video call) with an Admissions officer.

2. Confirmation of academic status: the applicant must either have successfully completed high school or qualify as a mature student of not less than 19 years of age as of the start date of the program. Applicants are required to submit official proof of high school graduation or equivalent, prepared in English or an official English translation. Please see the sections in the Academic Calendar for "Mature Students" and "Proof of High School Graduation".

3. Contract: an Enrollment Agreement must be completed and signed by the applicant, as well as her/his parent, or legal guardian if the applicant is a minor (less than 19 years of age).

4. Essay: applicants to degree programs (except the Associate of Arts degree) must independently conceive and write an essay of at least 250 words describing her/his academic and professional goals and how LaSalle College Vancouver can help them achieve those goals. A portfolio of work and/or a longer essay may also be required for some programs.

5. Fees: a \$50 Application Fee and a \$100 Assessment Fee. LaSalle College Vancouver may elect to waive these fees under special circumstances. The Application Fee will be refunded only if the applicant is not accepted.

6. English Proficiency: the language of instruction at LaSalle College Vancouver is English. All applicants to academic programs must demonstrate competency in the English language as described in the English Language Proficiency section of the Academic Calendar. 7. English placement: all degree-seeking applicants are required to submit official academic grades and test scores. Applicants who cannot provide proof of sufficient academic grades and/or who earn less than an acceptable language proficiency result are required to enroll in the appropriate developmental and/or transitional studies course(s) offered at LaSalle College Vancouver. Please see the section in the Academic Calendar for "Academic Placement" for a complete description.

8. Math placement: all degree-seeking applicants, and Visual & Game Programming diploma applicants, are required to submit official academic grades and test scores. Applicants who cannot provide proof of sufficient academic grades and/or who earn less than an acceptable math proficiency results are required to enroll in the transitional studies course offered at LaSalle College Vancouver. Please see the section in the Academic Calendar for "Academic Placement" for a complete description.

Applicants must accurately represent their education, age, and other required information to determine that they meet the admissions criteria for LaSalle College Vancouver programs.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds will be made within thirty (30) calendar days after the applicant's/student's written withdrawal request and all required documents for refund have been received by the finance department or within thirty (30) calendar days after written notice of dismissal is issued by the College and all required documents for a refund have been received by the finance department. All students will be subject to the institutional refund policies.

Degree Programs

Refund entitlement is calculated on the total fees due under the enrollment contract, less the applicable non-refundable Application and Assessment Fees. Where total fees have not yet been collected, the College is not responsible for refunding more than has been collected to date and a student may be required to pay for amounts due under the contract. Refunds will be made to the original account/payment method used to pay tuition.

All international degree students are required to pay a non-refundable tuition deposit upon registration. Students will be removed from any unpaid course/s and lose their non-refundable deposit if the College does not receive payment before the published deadline.

- Where a student is deemed not to have met the institutional and/or program-specific minimum requirements for admission, the institution must refund all fees paid under the contract, less the applicable non-refundable assessment fee.
- Application fee, student fees, textbooks, fines, dues owing, financial penalties and taxes are non-refundable. Outstanding tuition fees owing will be deducted from the amount refunded.
- Where a student's tuition has been paid in part or in whole by a recognized student aid program, the College may be required to refund the funding party before any refund is payable to the student.
- Where the College provides technical equipment to a student, without cost to the student, and the student withdraws or is dismissed, the College may charge the student for the equipment or use of the equipment on a cost recovery basis, unless the student returns the equipment unopened or as issued within fourteen (14) calendar days.
- In the event of a fully documented circumstance that prevents the student from completing the program, the student may appeal for an exception to this Refund Policy to the College Financial Appeals Committee.

APPENDIX A: PROGRAM OUTLINE Associate of Arts Degree

LaSalle College Vancouver aims to provide an Associate of Arts degree that successfully prepares graduates for further study in a Faculty of Arts bachelor's degree program at one of British Columbia's universities. The program's goals are to provide students with the knowledge, skills, and experiences that are foundational for further study in upper level coursework. The program also supports the development of strong critical thinking, communication and research skills sought after by employers.

Career Occupation: Students who graduate from the program will be prepared to begin further study at the baccalaureate level at LCV or one of the BC's research universities. While it is expected that the majority of students who graduate will pursue further education, students who choose to enter the workforce will have gained the communication, critical thinking and problem-solving skills that are so highly sought-after by employers.

Learning Objectives:

The overall objective is to prepare students to be successful in pursuing an undergraduate degree in the Arts, Humanities, Social and Natural Sciences. We seek to do this by providing our learners a comprehensive liberal arts education in a supportive and nurturing learning environment. The program has the following specific learning outcomes:

1. Demonstrate effective written communication skills by providing their audience with relevant and organized information on a specific topic.

2. Demonstrate effective oral communication by providing their audience with relevant and organized information on a specific topic.

3. Demonstrate the ability to interpret and analyze artistic work, historical events, or philosophical thought and describe the relevance of that work to themselves, society, and cultures.

4. Analyze the nature, diversity, and impact of social, political, psychological, and/or economic thought on the individual, institutions, and differing cultures.

5. Demonstrate critical thinking and problem-solving skills using mathematical and/or scientific reasoning to solve problems.

6. Demonstrate responsible use of information by discerning authority, by evaluating the relevance of information to their purpose, and by appropriately documenting sources.

Method(s) of Evaluation: Methods of evaluation are directly related to the learning objectives/outcomes and content of each course. Evaluation methods may include, but are not limited to, projects, essays, labs, class participation, seminar presentations, workbooks, portfolios, tests, critiques, and examinations.

Completion Requirements: In order to earn an Associate of Arts Degree, students must successfully complete 60 credit hours with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher. Students must also receive a passing grade or credits for all required course work and satisfy all financial obligations with LaSalle College Vancouver..
