You will receive an email 4 to 6 weeks prior to class start indicating it is time to register so it is important we have a current email address on file; set your email security setting to guarantee NBCC email delivery successfully to your inbox (check junk mail in case).

Important update from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC)

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) made an announcement on January 22, 2024 that will directly impact prospective international students who wish to study in Canada. You can review the IRCC news release <u>here</u>. We have outlined the details that impact New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) students below.

Study permit applications now require a Letter of Attestation

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) will be setting a cap on the number of study permit approvals issued for a two-year period (2024-2025). The New Brunswick cap will be provided to the provincial government and the province will distribute the New Brunswick cap amongst the designated learning institutions in New Brunswick, including NBCC.

As part of this cap implementation, as of January 22, 2024, all study permit applications will require a letter of attestation from the province. Provinces have until March 31, 2024 to establish a process to issue these letters of attestation.

NBCC will be working with the province moving forward to understand the process to issue letters of attestation to NBCC students and we will communicate this process to you as soon as we have more information. In the meantime, as of January 22, 2024, any application for a study permit submitted without a letter of attestation will be returned to the applicant (<u>Study permit: How to apply - Canada.ca</u>).

The following scenarios are not impacted by these newly imposed regulations:

- Study permit applications submitted to IRCC prior to January 22, 2024, or
- Study permit extensions submitted after January 22, 2024 for applicants already in Canada with a valid study permit.

Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP)

Based on the January 22, 2024 announcement, there are no impacts to the post-graduation work permit program (PGWPP) for NBCC students.

Spousal Open Work Permits

Based on the January 22, 2024 announcement, in the coming weeks (no specific date mentioned), NBCC students will no longer be eligible for apply for a spousal open work permit for their spouse or common-law partner for a period of two years (<u>Help your spouse or common-law partner work in Canada - Canada.</u> ca).

Please note that many programs at New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) - Designated Learning Institution #O19391556439 - require students to complete a work-integrated learning component to graduate and receive their academic credential.

The work-integrated learning component of NBCC programs may occur regularly throughout the program or take place in the final term of their program (in the case of a practicum or internship). NBCC's work-integrated learning components do not comprise more than 50% of the total program of study. Please see section 24 under Program Information in the acceptance letter for more details on the length and field of work for this student. As per his/her acceptance letter, in order that he/she may fulfill this essential component of the NBCC academic program requirements, we are requesting that this student be issued a work permit as per LMIA exemption code C32 for post-secondary international students, and pursuant to Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations (IRPR) subparagraph 205(c)(i.1):

205 A work permit may be issued under section 200 to a foreign national who intends to perform work that

(c) is designated by the Minister as being work that can be performed by a foreign national on the basis of the following criteria, namely,

(i.1) the work is an essential part of a post-secondary academic, vocational or professional training program offered by a designated learning institution as defined in section 211.1
