7. Methods of Payment

• CIBC Student Pay (Preferred Method)

• Bank Wire Transfer

Continue with the following steps, and the final instruction sheet will have the banking details for Bank Wire Transfer. Download and print the instruction sheet and take it to your bank for the Bank Wire Transfer. Payer must cover all the Bank Wire Transfer charges.

Internet Banking

Internet banking is available for Canadian bank account (use **Sheridan College** as payee, your student number as the reference/account number). You may also pay directly at your branch or through telephone banking.

8. Withdrawals and Refund Policy

Students must notify Sheridan of all withdrawals prior to the 10th day of class by completing the <u>International New Student Deferral/Refund Form</u>. All fees are subject to a non-refundable

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registration charge. This charge varies by program in the range of CAD \$1,038-\$3,800.

International students who are refused their study permit will receive a full refund of fees paid minus a \$200 administration fee provided they show proof of the refusal (copy of Immigration document) within the first 10 days of classes. The Health Insurance fee is Non-Refundable after the first day of class. All other refundable fees, except the late charge, will be refunded. Please allow eight weeks for processing a refund.
