Thank you for your interest in studying in Canada. I have reviewed your study permit application and supporting documentation to assess whether you meet the requirements for a study permit (<https://www.canada.ca/en/immigration-refugees-citizenship/services/study-canada/study-permit/eligibility.html>). I am refusing your application.

I am refusing your application because you have not established that you will leave Canada, based on the following factors:
- The purpose of your visit to Canada is not consistent with a temporary stay given the details you have provided in your application.
