- If it is determined that an applicant is deemed ineligible for a PAL or a country cap is reached and the deposit is received on behalf of the applicant, the full tuition deposit will be refunded to the applicant as per the Financial Refund Policy.
- The tuition deposit is non-refundable/non-transferable (with the exception of denied visa, or if the applicant is deemed ineligible for a PAL). Students who have been deemed ineligible for a PAL will receive a full refund equal to deposit received. All other eligible refunds will be equal to the deposit received less a \$500 administration fee.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PRE-ARRIVAL CHECKLIST

Your educational journey at Cape Breton University is about to begin. Here are some tips to set you up for success from day one. For more information visit cbu.ca/whatsnext

1. Register your Official CBU Email

Several days after your acceptance, you will receive instructions on how to log into your new <u>CBU Email Account</u> from CBU IT Services (<u>IT Services@cbu.ca</u>). This email will be sent to the personal email used on your Future Student Account.

CBU Students are required to check this email frequently, as all future communication from CBU will be sent here.

2. Sign into your Compass Student Account

Once you have accessed your <u>CBU Email Account</u>, you will then use this email to login to the Compass Student System. Your <u>Compass Student Account</u> provides student access to self-service functionality related to admissions, registration, timetables and exam schedules, tracking financials and more.

Instructions for how to access your Compass Student Account can be found at cbu.ca/your-accounts.

3. Review Tuition and Fees

Financial planning is important. Make sure to review CBU's tuition and fees ahead of time so you are prepared. You should also familiarize yourself with CBU's payment deadlines and accepted payment options at cbu.ca/tuition-fees. Programspecific tuition and fees estimates can be found by visiting cbu.ca/programs and selecting the program you will be studying.

4. Download Proof of Payment & Apply for Visa

Your proof of payment will be available for download through the **Student Finance** section of your <u>Compass Student</u>
<u>Account</u> within approximately 5-7 business days after your payment is made. For steps on how to access your proof of payment, please refer to <u>cbu.ca/whatsnext</u>. ***Note:** if you have paid a seat confirmation deposit, your account will show a credit (indicated by a negative).

Once you have all the required documents from CBU, it is time to apply for your visa. You can contact our International Student Advisors for guidance by emailing internationaloffice@cbu.ca.

5. Plan Accommodations

Securing housing plays a vital role in your student experience and it's important that students do not travel to Canada, or to Sydney, before securing proper accommodations.

6. Receive your First Year Advising Email

CBU students cannot register for classes until they have been advised. Advising information will be sent to your <u>CBU Email Account</u>. Visit <u>cbu.ca/advising</u> to learn more.

7. Register for Courses

Courses are limited, so we encourage you to register online for courses as soon as registration opens via your Compass
Student Account. Registration information will be sent with your First Year Advising Email and can also be found at Cobu.ca/registration. For a list of helpful FAQs, visit Cobu.ca/compass.

8. Request Student ID
