Cost of Living



Start Your Program

1. **Registration**
Upload a copy of your study permit to the [International Registration Portal](#) no less than two weeks prior to the start of classes. Registration is based on confirmation of your IRCC study permit approval.
2. **Extensions for Late Start**
You should plan to attend your program orientation and begin your studies on the first day of class. Our college does not provide extensions for late arrivals.
3. **Program/Campus Change**
Program/Campus changes are not permitted within the first year of studies once you have confirmed your admissions.

Orientation
